We are lucky to have attractive grounds around the home, with a lawned area and mature trees to the front and our courtyard garden at the back. This is where you'll find our summer house, which has a bar so you can enjoy a drink with garden views.





Bedrooms

We have 18 bedrooms upstairs with 14 downstairs, all with ensuite WC and hand basin facilities as well as two passenger lifts. The rooms are light and airy, and we encourage personalising these with keepsakes such as photographs. Each bedroom has a profiling



bed which can be raised at either end at the touch of a button for the most comfortable position, helping to promote independence and aid nursing care. Our communal bathrooms are also fully equipped with specialist bathing and showering facilities.

A Varied Activities Programme

We also have an additional lounge and a light-filled conservatory with views of the garden, both of which are often used for activities. Our activities co-ordinators do a great job organising a wide range of clubs and events – choose from arts and crafts, cookery, quizzes, gardening projects and more.
